Lingnan has various curriculum besides classes like Ving Tsun (traditional martial art), Volunteer service, Dance, Yoga etc. Personally I joined program to learn Ving Tsun and did volunteer work in Tuen Mun YMCA to teach English for the local students. I recommend reaching out for the opportunity to get to know the locals' life because it could bring you new perspectives and relationship. As international studies student, I took classes such as International Law, APEC, Greater China, Trade & Business of Asia, Culture & Economy. Especially for Korean Student who major in International Studies, I recommend to take classes related with South east Asia and China. Korean international studies often tend to focus on relationship among U.S., China, Japan. It would be beneficial to study on South East Asia and hear different view of mainland Chinese and Hong Kong people.
