As the students of International Industrial Engineering Program in our university, we are encouraged to join the student mobility scheme of ACUCA. We chose to study for two months in Tunghai University, Taichung, Taiwan. There in Tunghai, we learnt Chinese language intensively, including the traditional cultures of Chinese people.

In Taiwan, we lived at the student dormitory located inside the Tunghai University. We chose to live inside the campus since the dorm is nearby the CLC (Chinese Language Centre) and the cost is reasonable. Within the dorm, we lived with other THU students from different countries. THU has very good student facilities inside the campus. As exchange students, we could use the sport facilities such as swimming pool and some courts for free. We also can access the library, borrow books from it, and spend our time learning Chinese in the campus library.
