Especially, it was interesting to know about southeast Asian culture with exchange students from Malaysia, Thailand, and Brunei. Sometimes, I joined the travel organization. It was quite fun to travel with local people and exchange students. I think that both traveling alone and with friends are always good.

Middle of semester, I was a bit busy doing my homework and quiz but getting to be close with local friends. We experienced to local culture like taking a jeep and going to local restaurant by learning the food from local friends. Before that, I just found out area of surface but could know about something by relating the culture and history because of local friends and this made me memorize easily as well. I also went to capoeira class, which is one of the martial arts for Brazil, with exchange student who has learned it before. Thanks to that, I have met lots of local friends who are not near my university.

Choosing the Philippine was great choice for me. It was easier for me to get used to Asian culture and able to share our cultures with local people. At the same time, It was excited to spend a time with European exchange students who are interested in Asian culture by comparing our cultures. The Philippine is English speaking country but they have their own language as well so I also tried to learn their mother language because I think that language is basic measures for communicating with people.
