6. What did you study and what kind of activities did you take part in while abroad?

I studied literature and foreign language which is French. During studying abroad, I joined several organizations of the university. Apart from joining multicultural activities of the International Student Organization, I joined the organization called Kaingin. I taught English for underprivileged Filino children with the organization fellows every Sunday in assigned area in Quezon City. It was a great and memorable experience for me.

A difficulty for me must be about the language. Even though Filipino people have no problem in speaking or using English, the main language they use to communicate with friends is still Tagalog. Sometimes I felt like I was not part of them or close to them because I didn't know Tagalog.

9. Have you been changed in any way by the experience, and if so how?

Yes, I have been changed a lot in term of responsibilities that I had to balance my study and my leisure. My perspective in seeing this world is completely changed and I gain more confidence to live all by myself abroad. I was afraid if I was able to live by myself, especially in foreign countries. After joining the program, it assures my confidence about that. I have no problems in traveling abroad or living abroad anymore.

Even though our countries are in the same continent, Filipino cultures are completely different from Thai cultures. I think it is because Philippines is a multicultural country. You can criticize anyone and people will accept that. I think it is rare in any Asian cultures because we tend to avoid saying "no" or saying what you think it might offend other people. I like it that way. For me, it shows sincerity and obviousness.

They were big trips I had while I was in the Philippines. The trip that I will never forget is a trip in Palawan Islands. My friends and I spent many hours on a small boat. It was a bad timing because it was in a typhoon season. Going to the beaches or islands during the typhoon season is not a good idea, but we were eventually safe. I know that most students prefer to travel by themselves. However, to have a tour guide is good sometimes. You will be able to learn a lot about the history of the country or the island along with having a great time on the island.

For me, the good point of being an exchange student is that you will have friends from all over the world. To exchange ideas with them in any topics were amazing. You will see that they think differently from us. However, there is no the best culture in the world. We can learn things from each other and pick the best things to use in your life. In my case, I was a shy person and I was afraid of saying what I think due to the culture I had been raised. After being with European, American, and Filipino friends, I am more confident. My Japanese friends are examples of being hard-working and punctual. Now, I know what to behave if I happen to live or work with people from these different cultures. My world is changed after joining this program. I feel grateful that I made a decision to be an exchange student and I am even happier that the country I chose is Philippines.
