Reflecting on leadership experiences and community project outcomes.

Students present their Service Learning projects, receive feedback, and reflect on their learning journey.

Assessment Method:

Identify Community within the Campus or outside and develop community Mapping

Video Presentation (25%): Submission at the end of Module 3.

Conduct educative sessions in the community based on Needs Assessment (Pre and Post Assessment of community Engagement)

Report Submission (25%): Collaborative project submission by the end of Module 4.

Prepare and submit a written report about the learning goals and the activities conducted in the community with evidence.

Viva Voce and Reflective Journal (30%): Cumulative assessment covering all course material at the end of the course.

Reflective journal maintained on daily basis.
